

While Calgarians' trust has waned slightly, a majority remain generally satisfied with the way The City is being run.







Calgarians are growing more concerned about quality of life and the future of Calgary.






Community safety and wellbeing

While most Calgarians believe Calgary is safe overall, only a minority believe crime in their neighbourhoods has increased.

Housing

While a majority see both housing affordability and affordable housing as issues, around two-thirds believe rezoning will make it easier for Calgarians to live in communities that meet their needs.

92% Agree housing affordability (the amount a household pays for housing in relation to their total income) is an issue*

Agree the availability of **affordable housing** (housing projects that are often subsidized by government or other agencies) **is an issue***

64% Agree rezoning will make it easier for Calgarians to live in **communities** that meet their **needs***

Downtown

While around one-half say downtown is a desirable destination for leisure time, they acknowledge a primary motivation to go downtown is to be entertained though many cite safety concerns as a barrier.

Climate

Many agree climate change is real, that its effects will do some harm to them, and that The City should do more.

67% Agree the effects of climate change will harm them personally at some point in their lifetime.

Transit

While a solid majority are satisfied overall with bus and CTrain service, only one-half feel safe on the CTrain

74% Users feel a sense of safety and security when riding on Calgary Transit buses.*

72% Users satisfied overall with Calgary Transit CTrain service.*

69% Riders satisfied overall with Calgary Transit bus service.*

Social Equity

While a majority agree The City fosters an environment that is inclusive and equally accessible, less than one-half agree it delivers programs and services that remove barriers.

Agree The City fosters a city that is inclusive and accepting of all.

Event Centre

A majority agree the Event Centre will be good for Calgary's local economy and sports teams, while drawing more entertainment opportunities to the city.

47% Agree Calgary is attracting enough investment from outside the province to help our economy




Value for taxes

Calgary's perceived value for taxes is 2% higher than the average of other major municipalities*







Overall satisfaction with services has slipped as have perceptions of customer service






Importance vs. satisfaction grid






Importance vs. satisfaction grid: primary strengths





Investment in City programs and services Invest more increases: Spring 2023 – 2024








