- In June 2011, Calgary's 12-month-moving-average inflation rate increased to 1.2 per cent from 1.1 per cent in May and 0.2 per cent in June 2010. Nationally, the inflation rate also increased to 2.5 per cent from 2.3 per cent last month and 0.7 per cent in June 2010.
- The unemployment rate in Calgary was 5.7 per cent in June 2011, down from 7.4 per cent in the previous year. Nationally, the unemployment rate was 7.5 per cent, down from 8.1 per cent in June 2010.
- Total employment in the Calgary Economic Region (CER) was 774,000 in June 2011, an increase of 20,500 from 753,500 in June 2010.
- In June 2011, the average hourly wage in Calgary increased slightly to \$26.26 (1.3 per cent) compared to a year ago. In Alberta, the average hourly wage increased to \$25.28 (2 per cent) compared to June 2010.
- Between May 2010 and May 2011, the number of Calgarians receiving regular employment insurance fell by 36.2 per cent to 10,130. In Alberta, the number fell by 30.2 per cent to 34,400.
- In June 2011, the average price of oil (WTI) was USD\$96.29/bbl, down 5 per cent from May 2011. The average price of natural gas was \$3.78/GJ, up 2.4 per cent from May.
- The Canadian prime business loan rate remained unchanged at 3 per cent in June 2011.
- The Index of Consumer Confidence fell for the second straight month in June, this time dropping 2.5 points to 83.1 (2002 = 100).

- In May 2011, Alberta retail sales were estimated at \$5.2 billion (seasonally adjusted), a 0.2 per cent increase over the previous month and a 7.8 per cent increase year-over-year.
- Alberta wholesale merchants' sales were estimated at \$5.8 billion (seasonally adjusted) in May 2011, up 4.2 per cent from April and 16 per cent from May 2010.
- Alberta manufacturing sales were estimated at \$5.7 billion (seasonally adjusted) in May 2011, down 2.9 per cent from April 2011 but up 15.8 per cent from May 2010.
- The number of personal bankruptcies in Alberta was 617 in May 2011, down 3.6 per cent from the previous month and 8.2 per cent from May 2010.
- The number of business bankruptcies in Alberta was 22 in May 2011, up 29.4 per cent from April 2011 but down 37.1 per cent from May 2010.
- In June 2011, total housing starts in Calgary (CMA) reached 719 units, up from 707 units in May and up from 685 units last June.
- Calgary housing sales in June 2011 was 2,431 units, up 9.5 per cent from 2,220 units in May and 33.3 per cent from 1,824 units a year ago.
- June's MLS average price for Calgary was \$424,332, down 1 per cent from last month's average price of \$428,475 and down 2.1 per cent from \$433,248 a year ago.
