
## **Current Economic Analysis**

- In July 2011, Calgary's 12-month-moving-average inflation rate remained unchanged at 1.2 per cent but increased from 0.4 per cent in July 2010. Nationally, the inflation rate also increased to 2.6 per cent from 2.5 per cent last month and 1 per cent in July 2010.
- The unemployment rate in Calgary was 5.7 per cent in July 2011, down from 6.9 per cent in the previous year. Nationally, the unemployment rate was 7.3 per cent, down from 8 per cent in July 2010.
- Total employment in the Calgary Economic Region (CER) was 788,600 in July 2011, an increase of 19,300 from 769,300 in July 2010. There were increases in both full-time employment (17,200) and part-time employment (2,100).
- In July 2011, the average hourly wage in Calgary increased slightly to \$26.28 (0.5 per cent) compared to a year ago. In Alberta, the average hourly wage decreased to \$24.93 (-0.4 per cent) compared to July 2010.
- Between June 2010 and June 2011, the number of Calgarians receiving regular employment insurance fell by 33.5 per cent to 9,710. In Alberta, the number fell by 29.5 per cent to 34,330.
- In July 2011, the average price of oil (WTI) was USD\$97.34/bbl, up 1.1 per cent from June 2011. The average price of natural gas was \$3.51/GJ, down 7.1 per cent from June.
- The Canadian prime business loan rate remained unchanged at 3 per cent in July 2011.

- The Index of Consumer Confidence dropped for a third straight month in July, this time falling 1.8 points to 81.3 (2002 = 100) compared to last month.
- In June 2011, Alberta retail sales were estimated at \$5.2 billion (seasonally adjusted), a 0.3 per cent decrease over the previous month but a 7.4 per cent increase year-over-year.
- Alberta wholesale merchants' sales were estimated at \$6 billion (seasonally adjusted) in June 2011, up 3 per cent from the previous month and up 18.6 per cent from June 2010.
- Alberta manufacturing sales were estimated at \$5.6 billion (seasonally adjusted) in June 2011, down 0.9 per cent from the previous month but up 15.4 per cent from June 2010.
- Canadian real gross domestic product rose 0.2% in June after a 0.3% decrease in May. Real gross domestic product has been hovering around the same level since January 2011.
- In July 2011, total housing starts in Calgary (CMA) reached 658 units, down from 719 units in June and down from 1,166 units a year ago.
- Calgary housing sales in July 2011 was 1,976 units, down 18.7 per cent from 2,431 units in June but up 22.6 per cent from 1,612 units a year ago.
- July's MLS average price for Calgary was \$411,833, down 2.9 per cent from last month's average price of \$424,332, and down 1 per cent from \$416,064 a year ago.

Note: In January 2011, Statistics Canada applied a standard revision to its Labour Force Survey estimates following the release of final population estimates from Census 2006. As a result, the data that are related to employment have been revised accordingly.
