 - Actions to support communities with redevelopment

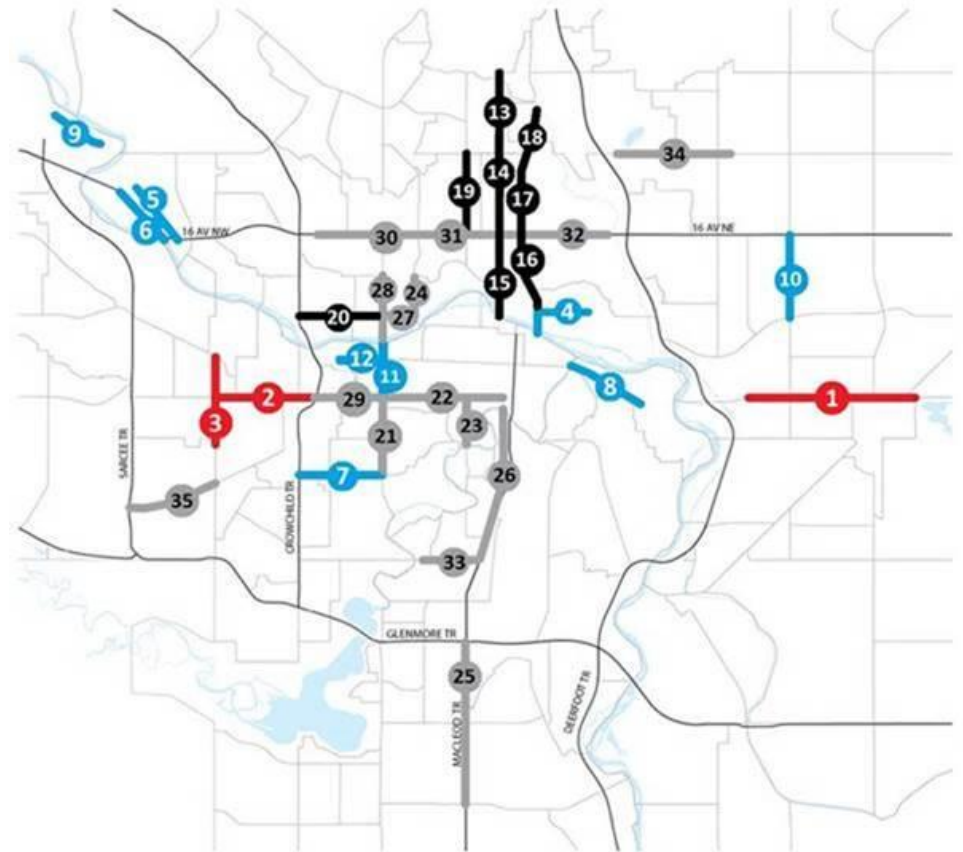


Off-Site Levy Bylaw

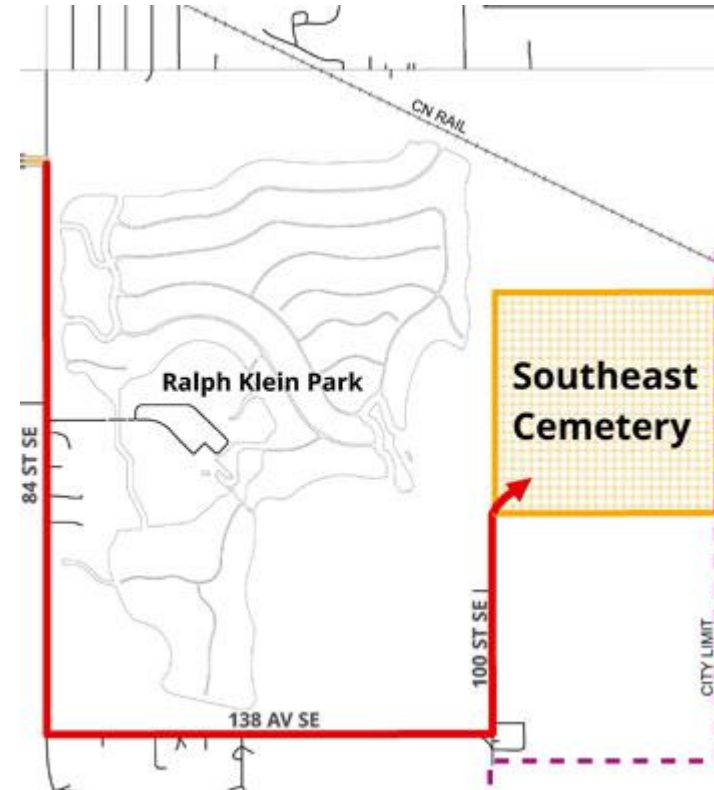
The Future of Stephen Avenue

- Short and long-term strategies to make Stephen Avenue better for Calgarians and visitors
- **Focus:** Public Realm Study with new streetscape design (2020). Construction/implementation (timing to be determined).



Focus: New cemeteries

- Southeast cemetery – Prairie Sky (opening in 2020)
- \$10 – \$15 million - North Cemeteries (timing over the next decade)



Budget 2020 – 2023+
\$25 million

Focus: The Capital Conservation Grant (CCG) supports lifecycle projects and engineering studies to eligible community associations and social recreation groups on City owned-land.

Downtown Emergency Response replacement, Varsity Emergency Response Station, Temporary fire stations and critical fire equipment, technology and vehicles.





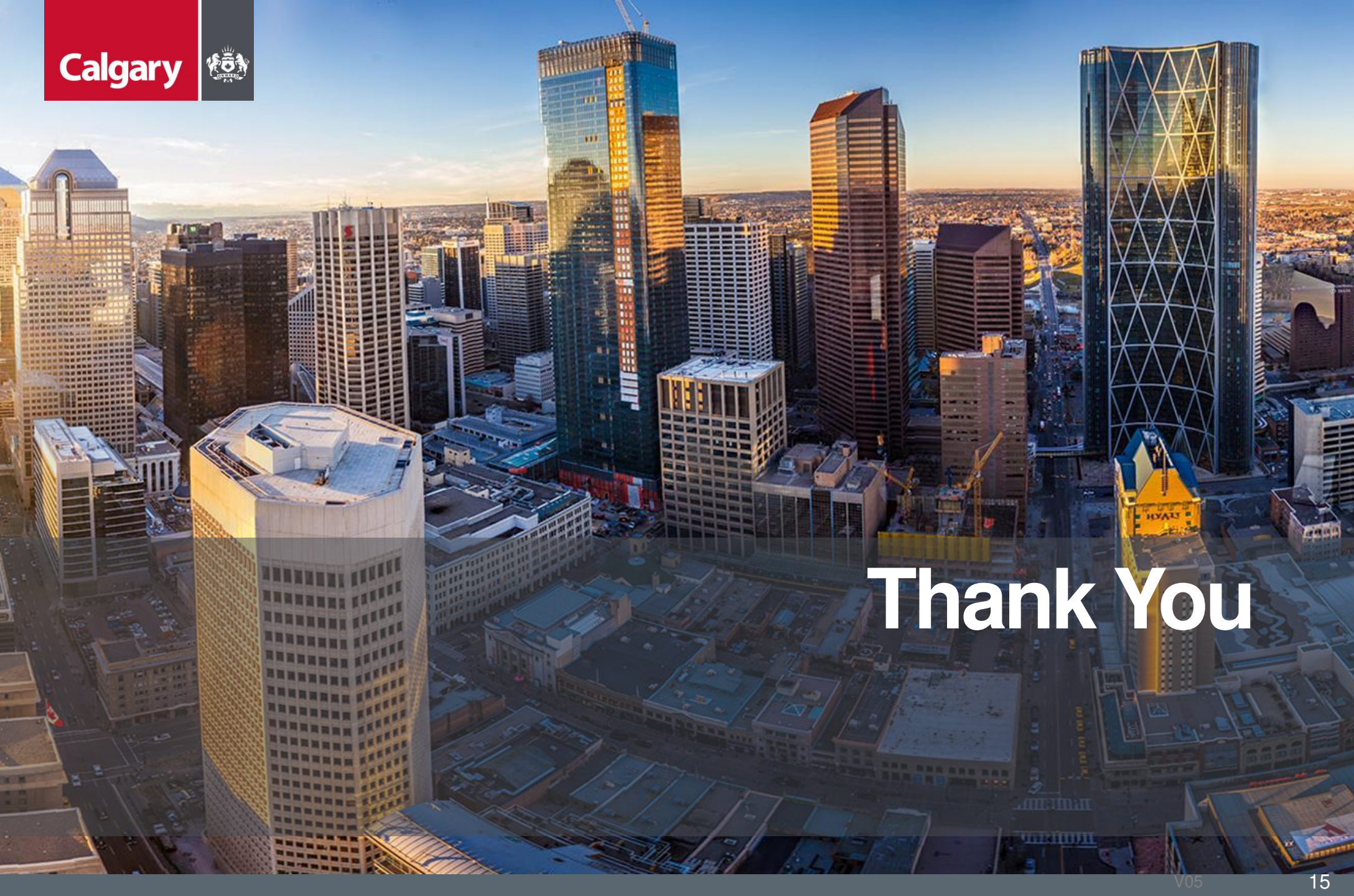
