

Older adult population by age band, 20211




Population

- In 2021, there were 177,405 Calgarians aged 65+, up 28% from 138,405 in 2016.¹
- In 2021, 14% of the population in Calgary (177,405) was aged 65+.^{1,2}
- Over the past 20 years, the population aged 65+ was the fastest growing age group in Calgary.^{1,2}
- Since 2001, the population aged 65+ has more than doubled from 81,150.^{1,2}
- The population aged 85+ has increased by 14.3%, from 17,860 in 2016 to 20,420 in 2021.¹

In contrast...

 The population aged 15 to 29 in 2021 has decreased by 3% from 2016 and is the slowest growing age group in Calgary.^{1,2}

Housing

- 22% of residents aged 65+ in the Calgary CMA lived alone in 2021.⁴
- 11,375 residents aged 65+ in the Calgary CMA lived in collective dwellings in 2021. These included nursing homes, residences for senior citizens, hospitals, and group homes.⁵ Of these, the majority (6,745) were aged 85+.⁵
- In 2021, there were 17,040 multigenerational households and 132,690 one person households.⁶
- Areas on the edges of Calgary, particularly those in the northeast, had the highest numbers of multigenerational households.⁶

Immigration

- In Calgary, 132,615 immigrants aged 55+ resided in private dwellings. Of these, 7,345 were recent (2016-2021) immigrants.⁷
- In 2021, 5% of recent immigrants in the Calgary CMA were aged 65+.8

Language

- In 2021, about 92% of Calgarians aged 65+ had knowledge of English.⁹
- Among the 33,345 people in Calgary with no knowledge of English, those aged 65+ made up 43%.⁹ This is a 6% increase from 2016.¹⁰
- English was the language spoken most often at home by people aged 65+
 in the Calgary CMA. After English, the language most often spoken at
 home was Yue (Cantonese), by 8,220 residents aged 65+¹¹.



Employment & Income

- In the Calgary CMA, 30,995 of Calgarians aged 65+ were employed, compared to 141,470 employed Calgarians aged 55+.¹²
- The median income (after tax) of people aged 65+ in Calgary in 2020 was \$33,600.¹³
- For men 65+ it was \$40,000 and for women 65+ it was \$29,000.¹³
- 10.4% of people aged 65+ in Calgary were in low-income based on the Low-income measure, after tax (LIM-AT) in 2020.¹⁴
