## **Permit Conditions**

- Where applicable; the applicant must have all necessary approvals from other City of Calgary Departments in conjunction with the Calgary Fire Department to ensure issuance of a permit.
- Companies or individuals contracted to perform any type of pyrotechnics/special effects need to apply for a Pyrotechnics/Special Effects Permit Application and must submit the following information to the Calgary Fire Department with this application.
- 1. Call 311 to request the specific type of permit you are applying for.
- 2. Request from the owner, Lessee or Agent for the property(s) to provide a written "Letter of Permission" to allow the Special Effect display to take place, whether it be indoors or outdoors.
- 3. Provide proof of insurance in the amount of \$5 million liability for all Special Effects. The Calgary Fire Department (or City of Calgary) should be listed as additional insured for all permits.
- 4. For pyrotechnics provide a copy of the "Valid Technician's Certificate" with photo, issued by the Explosive Regulatory Division.

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- 5. If required; provide a valid "User Magazine License" from the Explosives Regulatory Division. Said License is required in order to store explosives.
- 6. Provide a detailed Site Plan as described in the ERD Manual, Section 3.1
- 7. Provide a product list including manufacturer, type, size and quantity of product.
- 8. If the event is to be indoors, the Venue must provide a written fire safety plan and protocol including how they plan to mitigate a false alarm from the effects of the flame; should the venue have a fire detection system. If a false alarm is caused by the performance, a false alarm fee may be charged.
- 9. Provide a detailed Fire Safety Plan including:
  - a. Props or product being used
  - b. Where props or product are to be located. (Inside or Outside)
  - c. Who and how are the props or product being supervised
  - d. Distances from combustibles, staff and public. 5M minimum from public
  - e. Details and procedures for dealing with a large emergency
  - f. Details and procedures for dealing with a small emergency
  - g. Materials and equipment on-site for fire extinguishment and placement
  - h. Hot Zone security details and site plan
  - i. Fallout Zone security details and site plan
  - j. Details for cool down time, dismantling of show, clean-up and disposal of debris and fall-out
  - k. Required signage for public notification on-site and adjacent public areas
  - I. Any details for following day re-inspect and clean-up if needed
