#### **Terminology**

**INSTRUCTOR CLINIC** - A course at which instructors are trained and assessed within the desired context. Organized by Provincial Sailing Associations, includes both land and on-water sessions. Also called a 'Technical' clinic.

**EVALUATION** - Takes place at a clinic or at a home club within two years of an instructor being 'TRAINED'. It will be conducted by an appointed evaluator who will watch a land lesson & on-water coaching session and evaluate the instructor based on the context specific criteria.

**TRAINED** – An Instructor who has successfully completed a training clinic within a context. A trained Instructor is able to instruct and certify students within the context. They must successfully complete an evaluation within two years of becoming trained in order to maintain certification.

**CERTIFIED** – An Instructor who has successfully completed a training clinic and evaluation within a context. A certified Instructor is able to instruct and certify students within the context. Eligible for recertification at the end of the 3 year certification period.

CANSail 1 & 2 INSTRUCTOR - Can instruct and certify CANSail 1 & 2 sailor standards.

CANSail 3 & 4 INSTRUCTOR - Can instruct and certify CANSail 3 & 4 sailor standards.

**CAN**Sail 5 & 6 INSTRUCTOR - Can instruct and certify the CANSail 5 & 6 sailor standards.

**CAN** *Sail* **FUNDAMENTAL COURSE** - A classroom based course that covers the theory you need to know before taking a technical instructor clinic. This course also covers the National Coaching Certification Program (level 1 & 2 or A & B) content in a format specific to sailing. Once this course is complete the online 'Making Ethical Decisions' (MED) evaluation must also be completed online through the NCCP. This course is delivered by your Provincial Sailing Association.

**REGISTERING** with Sail Canada – All CAN Sail Instructors are required to register with Sail Canada each year in order to able to award CANSail levels, be eligible to coach at Sail Canada events, to be eligible for national coaching awards and to obtain their personal liability insurance. Registration can be completed through your Sail Canada online CAN Sail profile.
