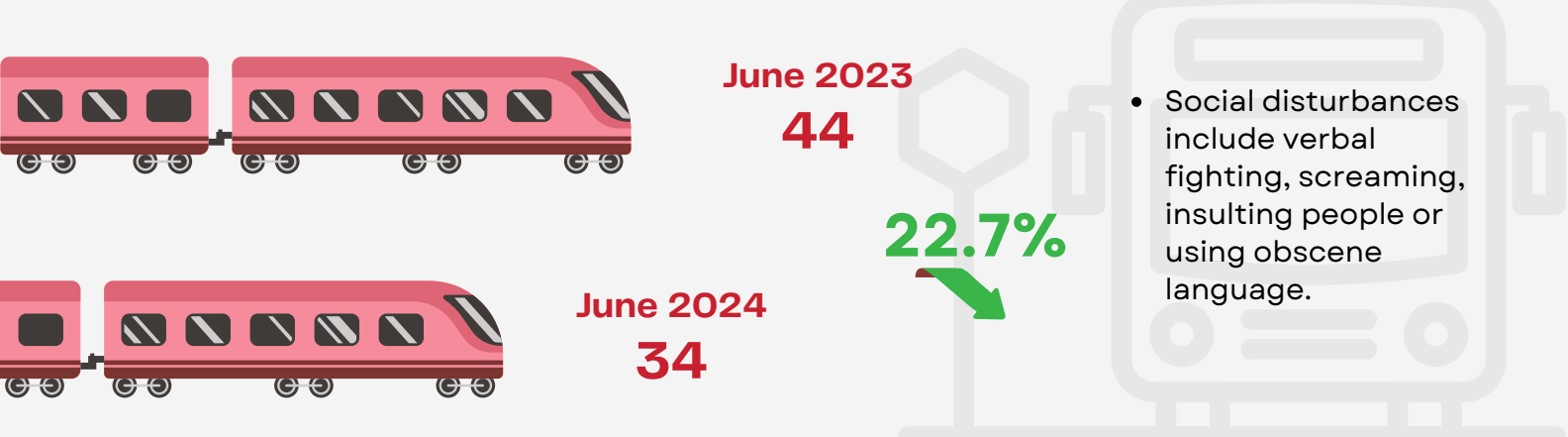

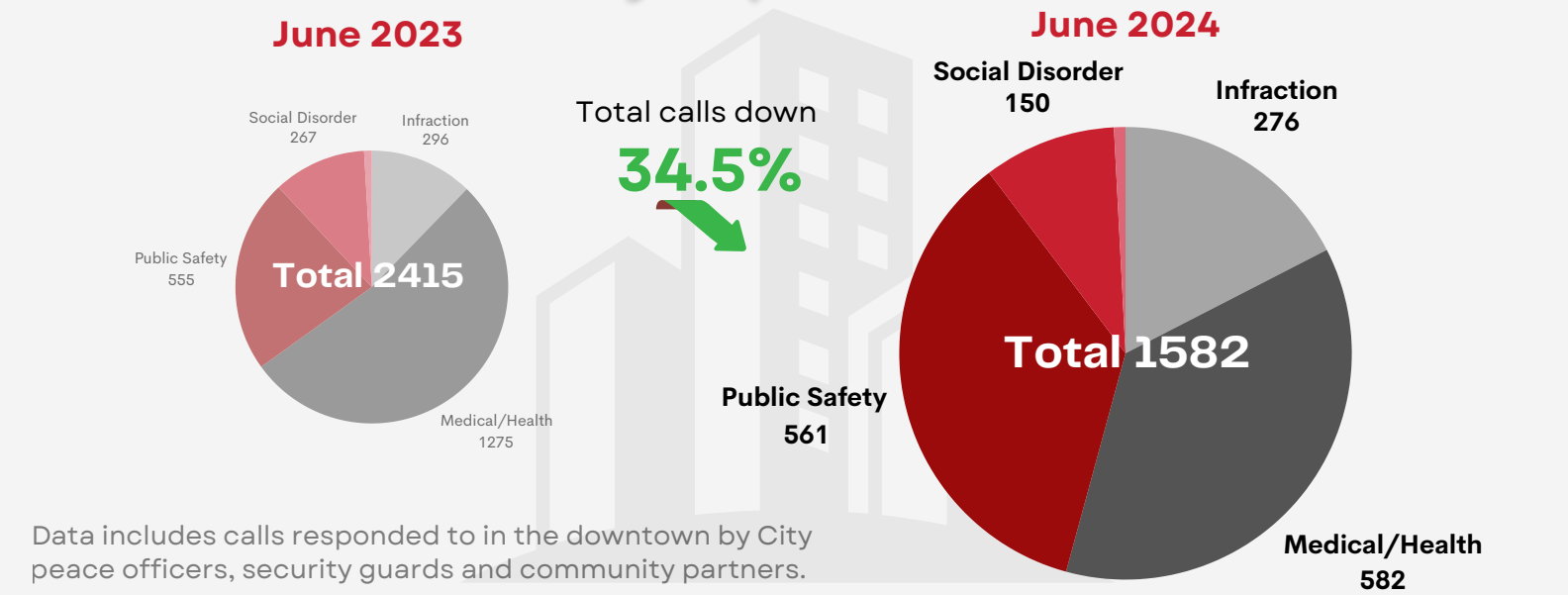

Transit Social Disturbances

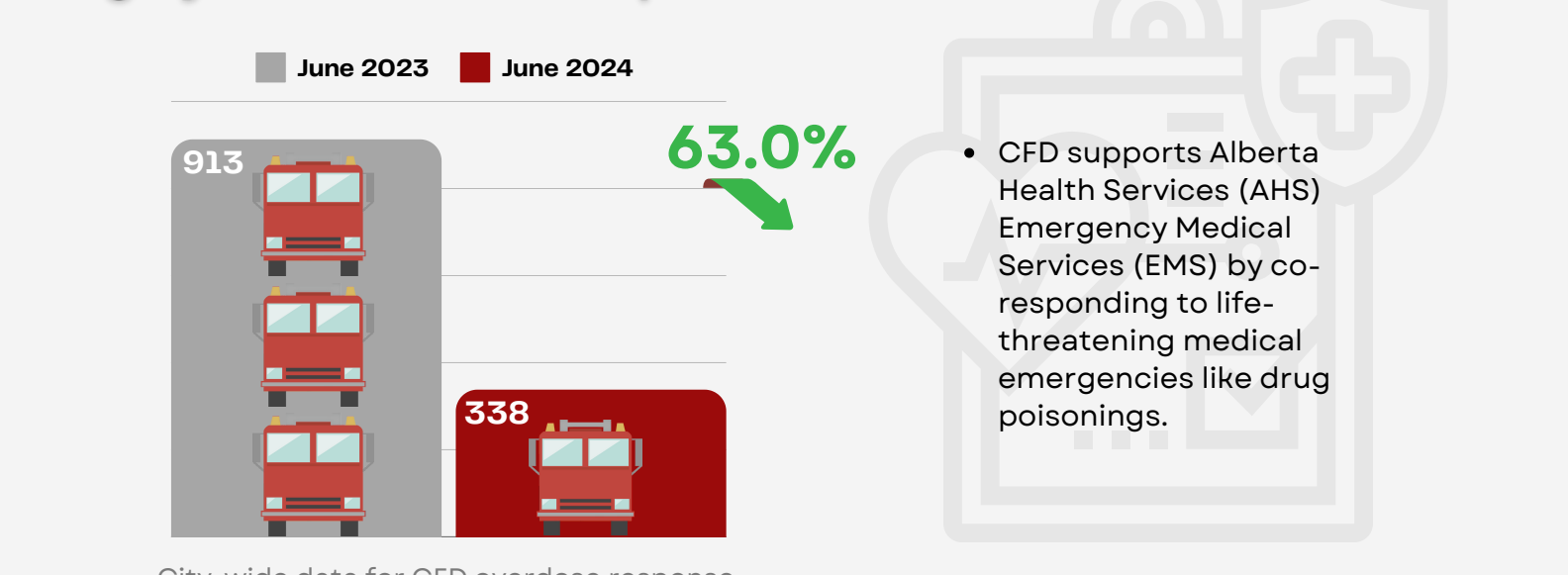

Calls for Downtown Safety Response

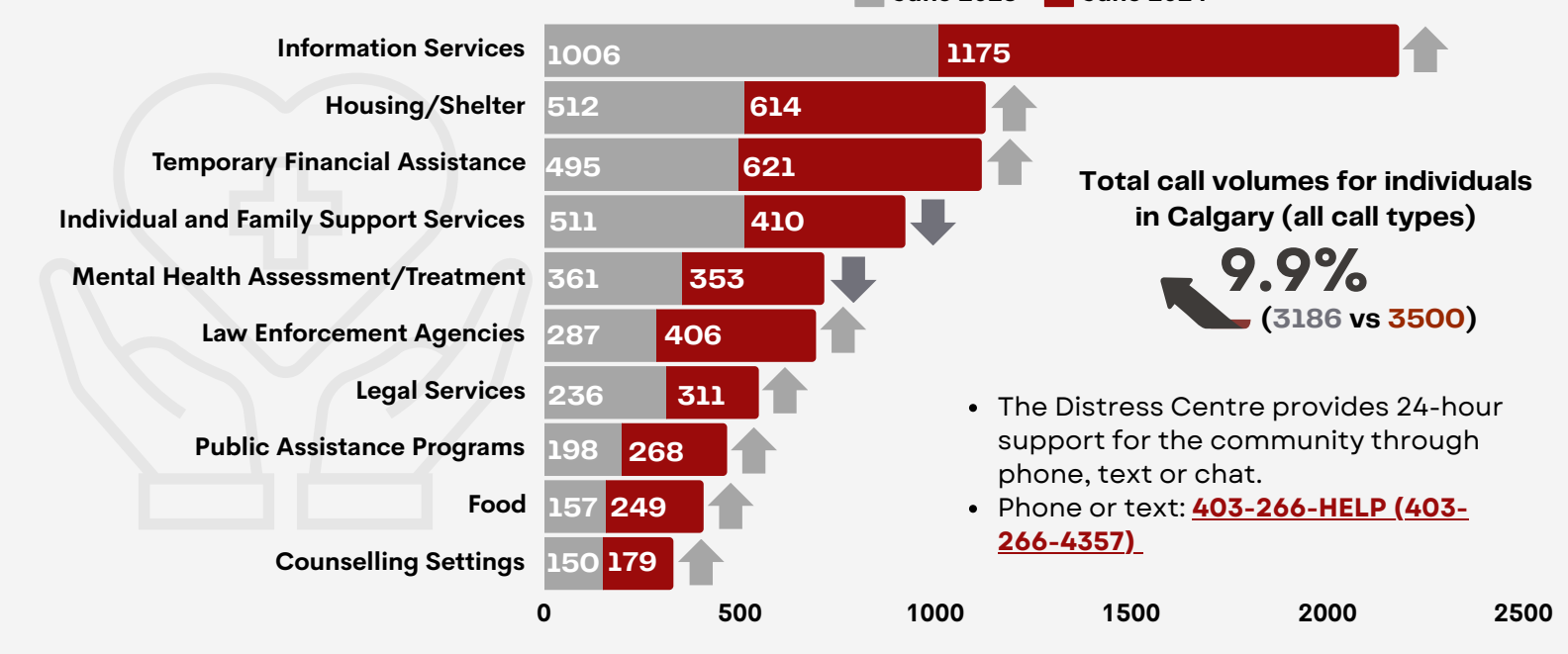


Calgary Fire Overdose Response

Top Calls to the Distress Centre

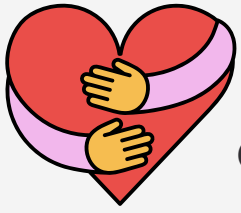


City Partner Spotlight:

Prevention and Addressing Family Violence

Builds a culturally competent support ecosystem for immigrants and newcomer women, youth, and families who are at-risk, victims, or survivors of family violence. Through education, support, counselling and outreach, helps build a sustainable, socially inclusive life in order to break the cycle of intergenerational violence.

2023 Outcome Data



Enrolled **182** clients in the program; reached **720** indirect beneficiaries. Created safety plans for **16** clients; helped **4** high-risk families receive crisis support.

New Washroom Attendant Program at Olympic Plaza: The attendant program has returned, providing a safe, clean washroom experience for park visitors 7 days a week from 9:30am to 9pm throughout the summer. Details are available at calgary.ca/washroomattendants.



City to Welcome 30 New Peace Officers into Service: On July 26, 16 new transit peace officers and 14 new community safety peace officers are graduating. These graduates will be pivotal in bolstering public safety and security across Calgary's transit systems and communities. They will be tasked with enforcing bylaws, assisting citizens and contributing to the overall wellbeing of the city's residents and visitors.

Community Court: The City, in partnership with Calgary Legal Guidance, is piloting an innovative approach to justice that connects Calgarians experiencing vulnerabilities with a court diversion process that offers community programs as an alternative to municipal bylaw fines.
