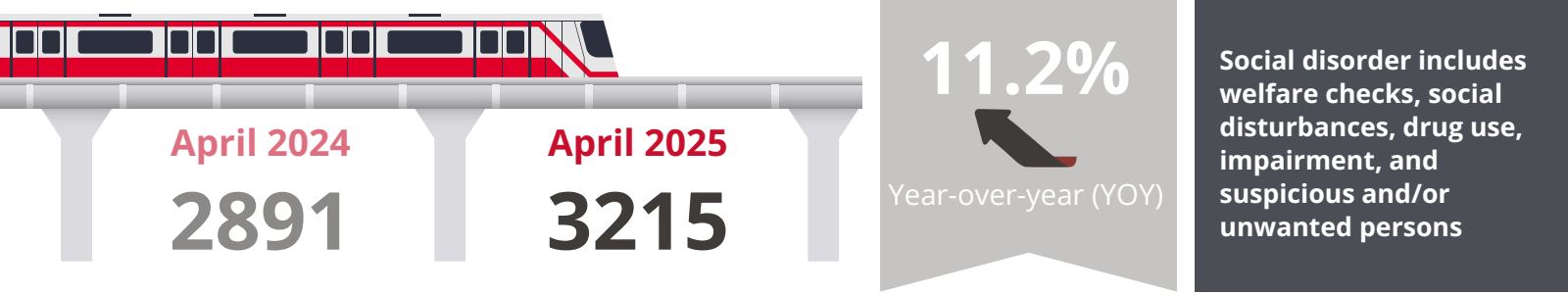




## Transit Social Disorder

## Calls for Downtown Safety Response

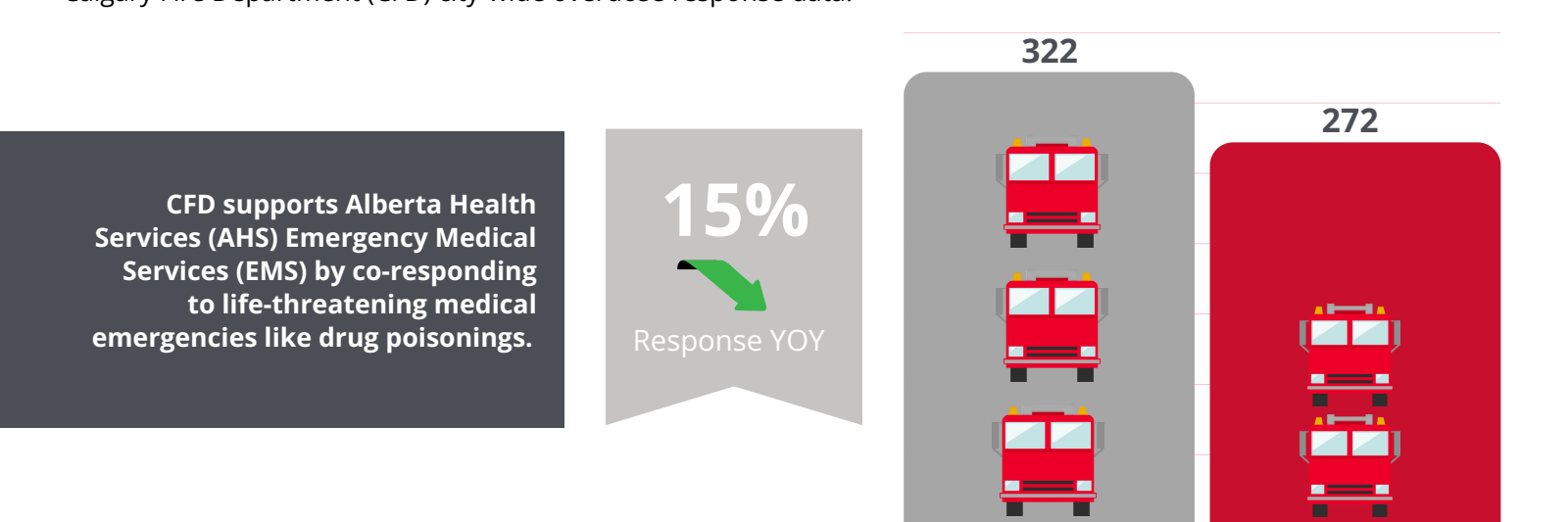
Calls responded to in the downtown core by City peace officers, security guards and community partners.



\*Some of this increase can be attributed to more precise data reporting with the implementation of enhanced dispatch software for use by City peace officers.

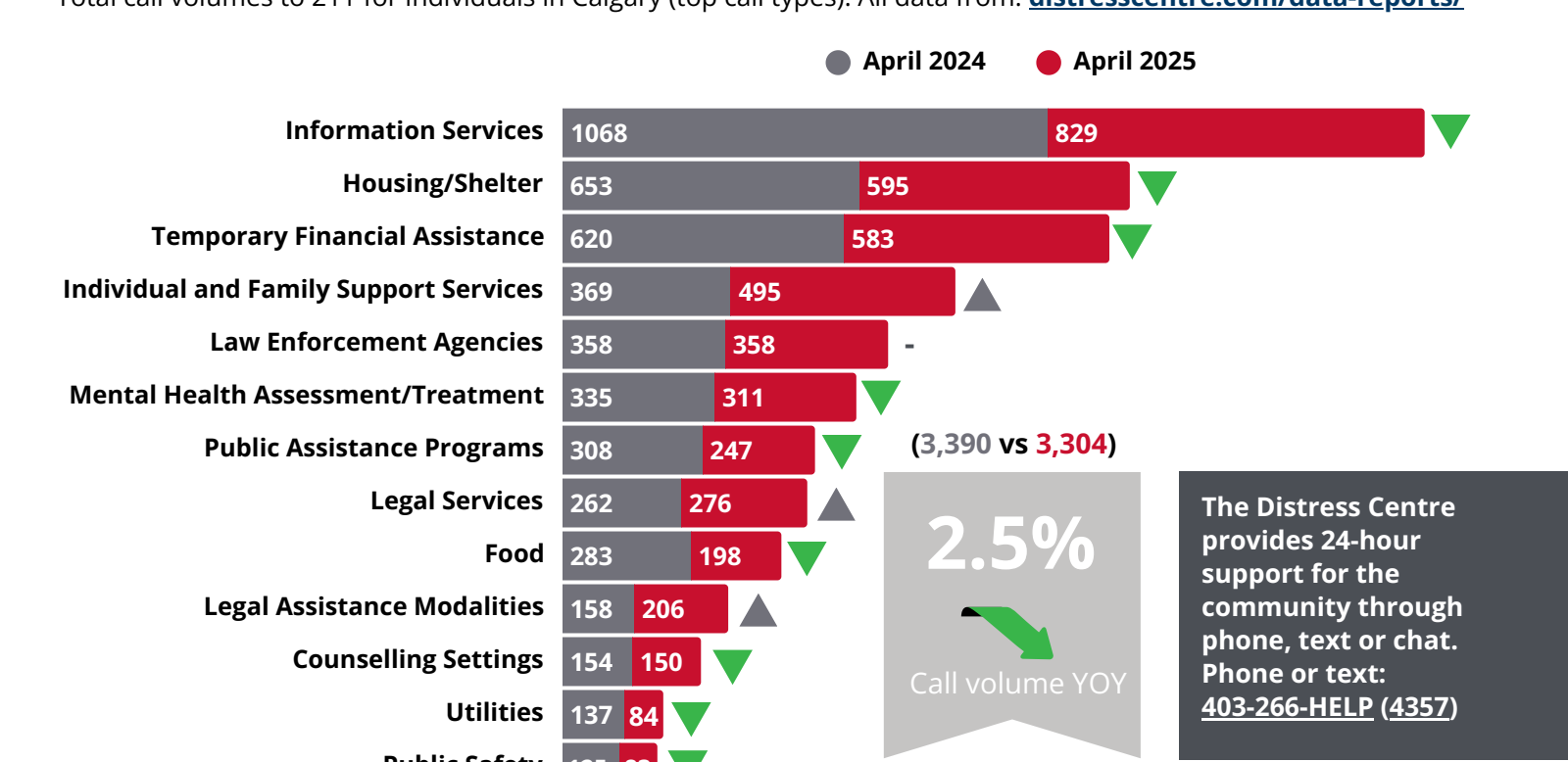
## Calgary Fire Overdose Response

### Featured Program: In the Lead

This innovative leadership and character-building program is designed to support youth who may be struggling to see, use and believe in their natural leadership abilities. The program works with youth who are navigating difficult challenges in their lives who often face many systemic barriers. It helps young people find what is strong in their lives through curriculum, program activities and positive adult mentorship that is proven to build resilience, reduce risk and nurture community connections.

### Community Impact

Program participants reported the following in a recent program survey:

- Personal Confidence – 91% Solidified Capacity
- Personal Awareness and Stress Management – 83% Solidified Capacity
- Emotional and Social Intelligence – 93% Solidified Capacity
- Courageous Leadership – 98% Solidified Capacity

### Additional Funding to Support Affordable Housing

The City is providing \$60 million in funding through its Housing Capital Initiative (HCI) to develop new non-market permanent rental housing units. An action from The City's Home is Here: Housing Strategy, the HCI fund is intended to support Calgary households in need of more affordable housing options. The City recently announced the seven successful non-profit applicants whose affordable housing projects have been selected to receive a total \$30.7M in funding from round one of HCI, supporting the delivery of an estimated 480 non-market homes for Calgarians in a range of project types. ### New Day Spaces for Calgarians Experiencing Homelessness

Calgary Homeless Foundation, in partnership with The City of Calgary, Calgary Police Service, and United Way of Calgary and Area are proud to announce the launch of two year-round Day Spaces to support those at risk of or experiencing homelessness in Calgary. Day Spaces provide alternatives to public spaces such as libraries, parks, and transit during the daytime hours. They aim to complement resource centres by offering a trauma-informed place for individuals to rest with a warm meal or beverage, while connecting to essential services and resources, such as connection to housing programs or shelters. Set to launch later in 2025, the two warming spaces, located at the Mustard Seed Community Impact Centre, as well as Journey Church Warming Centre, will be expanding to year-round Day Spaces as part of the ongoing success of their existing Extreme Weather Response (EWR) programming (as featured in April's Community Safety & Wellbeing Indicator Report).

### New Grant to Enhance Vibrancy and Inclusion Downtown

The City recently launched its Downtown in Motion Grant which supports registered non-profits and charities, Community Associations and Business Improvement Areas in creating vibrant, inclusive and financially sustainable arts, culture and sports initiatives in Calgary's greater downtown.

Whether it's a live performance, creative placekeeping, art installation or community event, this grant helps turn public spaces into places of connection and creativity — enhancing our city's cultural scene, improving access for all and contributing to a safer, more dynamic downtown. ## Tracking our Progress on Downtown Safety

The Downtown Safety Leadership Table (DSLTL) was a representative group of downtown leaders convened to help identify opportunities, solutions, and strategies to address safety issues in downtown Calgary. In March 2024, they released [28 recommendations](#) to support safety and vibrancy in Calgary's downtown. We are pleased to say that work is already underway on all 28 recommendations in the timelines anticipated. The work is targeted to three key areas: great public spaces, wellbeing of people, and emergency response and enforcement.
