



Background

- Council approved \$60M investment during Mid-Cycle Adjustments (Nov 2023) in response to the affordable housing crisis.
- Investment intended to leverage funding from other orders of government to support partners to build new affordable housing.
- The Housing Capital Initiative (HCI) is a competitive funding program that is delivering this investment to our partners.








Home is Here: Calgary's Housing Strategy

- Outcome 1: Increase the supply of housing to meet demand and increase affordability.
 - b) Use The City's funding tools to leverage partnerships with government and get more housing built.
- Coordinated with other orders of government to align and ensure the program can stack with existing funding programs.







Progress So Far

- In July 2024 The City launched Round One of the HCl program. Information on Round One projects can be found on our website www.Calgary.ca/HCl.
- As a result of the projects proposed, The City awarded seven applicants with \$30.7M to support the delivery of up to 480 nonmarket homes.
- We are now launching Round Two of HCI, intended to deliver up to \$29.3M to a new pool of eligible housing projects through another round of competitive process.







Key Program Criteria

Purpose of investment to support partners to increase affordable rental housing and leverage funding.

Applicants must:

- be an eligible group, including mandate / capacity to develop and operate non-market housing.
- provide non-market units at or below \$1,592.50/mth.
- commit to affordability for min. 20 years.
- bring at least 70% funding from other sources, meaning total request from City programs (new and existing) cannot exceed 30%.
- demonstrate capacity to deliver the project, operate and maintain affordability of that housing.







Additional Prioritization Criteria

Eligible projects will be prioritized for funding based on a range of criteria, including:

- providing rents below the \$1,592.50 baseline deeper levels of affordability.
- committing to longer term than 20-year min.
- bringing more than 70% funding from other sources – stretching City dollars further.
- delivering units quickly occupancy sooner than min. requirements.
- achieving better than baseline Building Code requirements for energy efficiency and accessibility.

Eligible Project Types

Deliver new units through:

- construction of new residential units.
- acquisition of existing residential buildings.
- conversion of non-residential buildings to residential units.
- addition of new residential units to existing buildings or properties (min. five net new).

- October 3rd: Hard Close to All Submissions
- October / November 2025 City Review
- Q4 2025 / Q1 2026 Successful Projects Announced
